School Neuropsychology Post-Graduate Certification Program

A 11-month, competency-based Continuing Education Program designed to train school psychologists and psychologists to integrate neuropsychological principles into their professional practices.

Classes Meet Once a Month using Online Webinars and Face-to-Face Formats Starting in September, 2010 and ending in July, 2011

KIDS, Inc. is approved by the National Association of School Psychologists to offer continuing education for school psychologists. KIDS, Inc. maintains responsibility for the program.

The purpose of this course is to train school psychologists and psychologists who work with children to integrate neuropsychological principles into their professional school-based practices. This 10-month long, competency-based training program will provide participants with a blend of a **knowledge base** in contemporary neuropsychological theory, assessment techniques, and evidence-based interventions; **competency-based skills** in administering and interpreting common neuropsychological instruments for school-aged children; and **supervised practice** of those new skills. The classes meet once a month on a weekend: Friday nights 6-9 pm, Saturdays 8 am - 5 pm, and Sundays 8 am - 4 pm. Successful graduates of the program, who are certified or licensed school psychologists, will be eligible to apply for the Diplomate in School Neuropsychology from the *American Board of School Neuropsychology* (ABSNP). Successful graduates of the program also earn 180 hour of continuing professional development units (CPDs).

Cost of the Program

The **tuition for the program is \$5,000**. A \$500 deposit is required to secure a space in one of the classes. An online registration form may be found at www.schoolneuropsych.com.
